A parable is a true-to-life story designed to teach a truth or answer a question.

- 1. Begin with the immediate context.
 - a. What was the occasion for telling the story?
 - b. Is there an explanation of the meaning?
- 2. Identify the central point of meaning.
- 3. Identify details that do not support the central point of meaning.
- 4. Identify details that support the central point of meaning.
- 5. Compare parallel and contrasting passages.
- 6. Base doctrine on clear literal passages.

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
